ACADEMIC SUPPORT:

Designed to support students' school success through such efforts as homework assistance and "test sophistication" training sessions. Homework assignments are directly related to classroom instruction and not to introducing new content. National PTA rule is 10 minutes homework per grade.

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ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT:

This kind of programming academic in its focus (as opposed to social, cultural or recreational enrichment) is that it provides young people with an opportunity to practice their academic skills - such as reading, writing, speaking, mathematical calculation and scientific inquiry.

Character Education

Character education is the teaching of core values. Pillars of character™: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship Effective programs engage children in hands-on activities where good character is emphasized throughout the school environment as well as through the curriculum.

Youth Leadership

Both an internal and an external process leading to •(1) the ability to guide or direct others on a course of action., influence their opinion and behavior, and show the way by going I advance; and (2) the ability to analyze one’s own strengths and weaknesses, set personal and vocational goals, and have the self-esteem to carry them out.

Arts

(Literary arts, media arts, visual arts, performing arts, visual arts)

Research shows a clear correlation between early exposure of children to the arts and increased long-term critical reasoning, communication and social skills.

Anecdotal information that effective youth arts programs result in improved self-esteem, increased skills, and improved school or work behavior.

Real World Exploration

Older youth need to participate in the activities that shape their own lives. Opportunities to develop and use new talents, skills, and interest in the context of the “real world”.

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
